Euphorbia 'Diamond Dazzler'

Euphorbia graminea hybrid

KEY BENEFITS

Everyone in the garden world knows *Euphorbia* 'Diamond Frost'. Now there is another called '**Diamond Dazzler'**. It is a beauty. In sheltered positions protected from cool winds it flowers 24/7 every day of the year just like 'Diamond Frost' does. How is it different? The flowers are fully double, it is very compact hugging the rims of any pots it is grown in and it is fully white. Grown as a specimen plant in pots up to 250mm in diameter it does well. As with 'Diamond Frost', '**Diamond Dazzler'** shows up well in the night garden.

ORIGIN

'Diamond Dazzler' was developed in a new breeding programme in Germany when selections were made with the overall aim of a double 'Diamond Frost'. It was an all-consuming exercise with many seedlings discarded. Going from the first plants of *Euphorbia graminea* which were used to breed and select from to 'Diamond Frost' and thence to **'Diamond Dazzler'** has been an interesting journey. USES

- Decorator pots up to 250mm in size grow in full sun to partial shade.
- Garden edging planting in full sun to semi-shade.
- Combination plantings in pots, a winner.
- Ideal edging plant as a semi-formal flowering hedge.
- Grows no more than 25cm high
- Shelter from heavy frosts.

CARE

After care is really minimal. We have not seen any problems with insect pests or other diseases. Fertiliser, as slow release, organic or liquid should be applied three or four times a year. Because of the compact growth habit pruning is minimal. If cutting back wait for warm days and cut back by half. Apply fertiliser at this time when you have finished the pruning. In garden beds mulching to conserve moisture is beneficial. Take care that the mulch is not placed close to the main stem of the plant.
